## INTRODUCTION

This is the sixteenth annual edition of the Private Property Congressional Vote Index. The League of Private Property Voters (LPPV) has published the Index each year since 1989.

LPPV is a coalition of more than 600 grassroots organizations that advocate the rights of property owners, including farmers, ranchers, woodlot owners, residents of rural communities, owners of recreational property, and inholders of private property located within and adjacent to federal lands. It also includes cabin permittees, off-road vehicle owners, equestrians, snowmobilers, hunters and recreational shooters, and livestock grazers, foresters and miners who make productive use of federal lands.

Votes for this year's Index were chosen from discussions among approximately twenty five leaders of the Wise Use movement nationwide. These votes represent 2003's most important snapshots demonstrating protection of the constitutional rights of property owners against a powerful and overbearing federal government. They also show support for recreational and commercial access for federal lands, upon which many rural communities depend and all Americans share.

We encourage readers to examine the voting records of their Senators and Members of Congress. Please thank those that stood up for us, and educate the rest.

## CHAMPIONS AND ENEMIES

A CHAMPION of Property Rights is a score of 80% or higher on the LPPV Index.

An ENEMY of Property Rights is a score of 20% or lower on the LPPV Index.

### Senate:

The Senate was generally supportive. It voted in support of the Healthy Forest Initiative and to repeal the Estate Tax while also rejecting ill-advised proposals to vastly expand federal spending and regulations that would have damaged private property rights and multiple use of federal lands.

There are 36 Champions of Property Rights, all Republicans and 37 Enemies of Property Rights, all Democrats.

### House:

The House supported private property rights and to protect public lands access more often than not. This included votes on both recreational and commercial access. It also approved the Healthy Forest Initiative, with its superior version prevailing in the House-Senate conference and being signed into law.

There were 198 Champions of Property Rights, including 195 Republicans and Democrats John (LA), Peterson (MN) and Stenholm (TX). There were 171 Enemies of Property Rights, including 162 Democrats and Republicans Saxton, Smith, Ferguson and LoBiondo (all NJ), Ramstad (MN), Leach (IA) and Johnson, Shays and Simmons (all CT).

## US SENATE VOTES

**#1 - REPEAL THE DEATH TAX – Senate Vote 62 - S Con Res 23: Fiscal 2004 Budget Resolution - Estate Tax Repeal** March 20, 2003 - Kyl, R-Ariz., amendment that would accelerate repeal of the estate tax from 2010 to 2009. The Death Tax is a major reason for the breakup of businesses and Adopted 51-48: R 47-4; D 4-43; I 0-1. **LPPV POSITION: YES**

**#2 - LAND TRUST TAX BREAK – Senate Vote 127 - S 476: Charitable Contributions - Land Sales**

April 09, 2003 - Grassley, R-Iowa, motion to table the Nickles, R-Okla., amendment. Senator Nickles amendment would have eliminated the special deal that land trusts carved out for themselves in S 476 - sellers of land get a tax break - ONLY if they sell to land trusts! It allows gigantic outfits like the Nature Conservancy to undercut on price other nonprofit buyers of land such as churches and nonpublic schools, as well as placing private parties at a disadvantage. This special deal for land trusts, which would have cost taxpayers nearly one billion dollars in lost revenue, was dropped from the bill later.

Motion agreed to 62-38: R 14-37; D 47-1; I 1-0. **LPPV POSITION: NO – SCORED WITH A DOUBLE WEIGHT**

**#3 - REDUCE LEGAL BARRIERS TO FOREST THINNING – Senate Vote 423 - HR 1904: Forest Thinning - Judicial Review**

October 30, 2003 - Cochran, R-Miss., motion to table (kill) the Leahy, D-Vt., amendment no. 2039 that would strike sections in the bill that deal with administrative and judicial reviews.

Motion agreed to 62-33: R 51-0; D 11-32; I 0-1. **LPPV POSITION: YES**

**#4 - REDUCE DELAYS FOR FOREST THINNING – Senate Vote 426 - HR 1904: Forest Thinning - Environmental Impact Statements**

October 30, 2003 - Crapo, R-Idaho, motion to table (kill) the Cantwell, D-Wash., amendment no. 2038 that would require the Comptroller General to study the costs and benefits of the analysis of alternatives in environmental assessments and environmental impact statements. Motion agreed to 57-34: R 46-3; D 11-30; I 0-1. **LPPV POSITION: YES**

**#5 - FARMLAND LAND GRAB – Senate Vote 442 - HR 2673: Fiscal 2004 Agriculture Appropriations - Conservation Reserve Program**

November 06, 2003 - Leahy, D-Vt., amendment no. 2119 that would bar the Agriculture Department from spending funds designated for land acquisition for technical assistance instead from the Conservation Reserve Program. Rejected 38-56: R 10-39; D 27-17; I 1-0. **LPPV POSITION: NO**

**#6 - MYERS NOMINATION – Senate Vote 158: Myers Nomination - Cloture**

July 20, 2004 - Motion to invoke cloture (thus limiting debate) on President Bush's nomination of William G. Myers III of Idaho to be a judge for the U.S. Court of Appeals for the 9th Circuit.

Myers is an advocate of private property rights and should have been confirmed as a judge. Motion rejected 53-44: R 51-0; D 2-43; I 0-1. **LPPV POSITION: YES**

Note: Three-fifths of the total Senate (60) is required to invoke cloture. A "yea" was a vote in support of the president's position.

## US HOUSE VOTES

### **#1 - OPEN UP ANWR – House Vote 134 - HR 6: Energy Plan - ANWR Limit**

April 10, 2003 - Wilson, R-N.M., amendment that would limit to 2,000 acres the maximum surface area that could be used by oil production facilities in the Arctic National Wildlife Refuge.

Adopted 226-202: R 196-30; D 30-171; I 0-1. **LPPV POSITION: YES**

### **#2 - REPEAL THE DEATH TAX – House Vote 288 - HR 8: Estate Tax Repeal - Passage**

June 18, 2003 - Passage of the bill that would make permanent the repeal of the estate tax contained in the 2001 tax cut law (PL 107-16) and which is set to expire after 2010.

Passed 264-163: R 223-4; D 41-158; I 0-1. **LPPV POSITION: YES**

### **#3 - STARVE THE KLAMATH BASIN FARMERS – House Vote 380 - HR 2691: Fiscal 2004 Interior Appropriations - Klamath Wildlife Refuge**

July 17, 2003 - Blumenauer, D-Ore., amendment that would bar funds from being used to enter into new agricultural leases that allow growing row crops or alfalfa in Oregon's and California's Lower Klamath and Tule Lake National Wildlife Refuges.

Rejected 197-228: R 20-205; D 176-23; I 1-0. **LPPV POSITION: NO**

### **#4 - LOCK UP THE FEDERAL LANDS – House Vote 386 - HR 2691: Fiscal 2004 Interior Appropriations - Roadless Lands**

July 17, 2003 - Inslee, D-Wash., amendment that would prohibit funds from being used to change the Roadless Area Conservation Rule. Rejected 185-234: R 20-200; D 164-34; I 1-0. **LPPV POSITION: NO**

### **#5 - PERMIT REASONABLE RIGHTS OF WAY – House Vote 388 - HR 2691: Fiscal 2004 Interior Appropriations - Rights-of-Way on Public Lands**

July 17, 2003 - Taylor, R-N.C., amendment to the Udall, D-Colo., amendment. The Taylor amendment would limit “disclaimers of interest,” which allow the Bureau of Land Management to grant non-federal entities rights-of-way on public lands without congressional approval, in national monument, park and wilderness areas. The Udall amendment would prohibit funds from being used to carry out any disclaimers of interest. Adopted 226-194: R 206-14; D 20-179; I 0-1. **LPPV POSITION: YES**

### **#6 - EASE PERMITTING FOR ENERGY PROJECTS – House Vote 242 - HR 4513: Alternative Energy Projects - Passage**

June 15, 2004 - Passage of the bill that would streamline licensing and siting for alternative energy projects on federal lands.



Federal agencies would not be required to identify different project locations, other than the proposed action and a “no action” alternative, when preparing an environmental assessment or impact statement for a renewable energy project. Passed 229-186: R 200-18; D 29-167; I 0-1. **LPPV POSITION: YES**

**#7 - ALLOW OPEN-ENDED CLAIMS OF SACRED SITES – House Vote 252 - HR 4568: Fiscal 2005 Interior Appropriations - American Indian Sacred Sites**

June 16, 2004 - Rahall, D-W.Va., amendment that would prohibit funds from being used to adversely affect American Indian sacred sites on certain federal lands. The amendment would permit Indian Tribes to define “Sacred Lands” as just about anything imaginable, opening up opportunities for fraudulent claims. Rejected 209-215: R 15-206; D 193-9; I 1-0. **LPPV POSITION: NO**

**#8 - STOP FOREST MANAGEMENT – House Vote 254 - HR 4568: Fiscal 2005 Interior Appropriations - Forest Management Plans**

June 16, 2004 - Udall, D-N.M., amendment no. 3 that would prohibit funds from being used to finalize or implement regulations that would change scientific and public input criteria related to developing forest management plans. Rejected 195-230: R 20-202; D 174-28; I 1-0. **LPPV POSITION: NO**

**#9 - ANIMAL RIGHTS FOR BISONS – House Vote 261 - HR 4568: Fiscal 2005 Interior Appropriations - Bison in Yellowstone Park**

June 17, 2004 - Hinchey, D-N.Y., amendment no. 18 that would bar funds from being used to kill, or assist in killing, bison in Yellowstone National Park. Rejected 202-215: R 34-184; D 167-31; I 1-0. **LPPV POSITION: NO**

**#10 - STOP SNOWMOBILES IN YELLOWSTONE – House Vote 263 - HR 4568: Fiscal 2005 Interior Appropriations - Snowmobiles in Yellowstone and Grand Teton Parks**

June 17, 2004 - Holt, D-N.J., amendment no. 4 that would block funds from being used to do anything inconsistent with the phase out of recreational snowmobile use in Yellowstone and Grand Teton National Parks. Rejected 198-224: R 28-195; D 170-28; I 0-1. **LPPV POSITION: NO**

**#11 - DE-FUND THE UNITED NATIONS – House Vote 333 - HR 4754: Fiscal 2005 Commerce, Justice, State Appropriations - UNESCO Funds**

July 07, 2004 - Paul, R-Texas, amendment that would prohibit the use of funds in the bill to pay for any U.S. contribution to the United National Educational, Scientific, and Cultural Organization (UNESCO). Rejected 135-283: R 132-90; D 3-192; I 0-1. **LPPV POSITION: YES**
