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INTRODUCTION

This is the eighteenth annual edition of the Private Property Congressional Vote Index. The League of Private Property Voters (LPPV) has published the Index each year since 1989.

LPPV is a coalition of more than 800 grassroots organizations that advocate the rights of property owners, including farmers, ranchers, woodlot owners, residents of rural communities, owners of recreational property, and inholders of private property located within and adjacent to federal lands. It also includes cabin permittees, off-road vehicle owners, equestrians, snowmobilers, hunters and recreational shooters, and livestock grazers, foresters and miners who make productive use of federal lands.

Votes for this year's Index were chosen from discussions among approximately twenty five leaders of the Wise Use movement nationwide. These votes represent the most important snapshots demonstrating protection of the constitutional rights of property owners against a powerful and overbearing federal government. They also show support for recreational and commercial access for federal lands, upon which many rural communities depend and all Americans share.

We encourage readers to examine the voting records of their Senators and Members of Congress. Please thank those that stood up for us, and educate the rest.

CHAMPIONS AND ENEMIES

A CHAMPION of Property Rights is a score of 80% or higher on the LPPV Index.

An ENEMY of Property Rights is a score of 20% or lower on the LPPV Index.

Senate:

The Senate cast important votes on opening up public lands and repealing the death tax. It was generally supportive of private property rights and multiple use of federal lands.

There were 27 Champions of Property Rights, 26 Republicans and Senator Nelson (D-NE).

There were 25 Enemies of Property Rights, all Democrats.

House:

The House had an excellent 109th Congress. It approved landmark revisions, including compensation to property owners, to the Endangered Species Act, voted to overturn the disastrous Kelo Supreme Court decision, repeal the Death Tax, expand energy exploration, and improve property owners access to the courts.

There were 190 Champions of Property Rights, including 181 Republicans and Democrats Cramer (AL), Berry (AR), Ross (AR), Costa (CA), Melancon (LA), Peterson (MN), Boren (OK), Cuellar (TX) and Edwards (TX).

There were 146 Enemies of Property Rights, 143 Democrats and Republicans Ehlers (MI), Boehlert (NY) and Kelly (NY).

#1 - CONFIRM PRO-PROPERTY RIGHTS JUDGE
— Senate Vote 131 - Brown Nomination - Confirmation
June 08, 2005 - Confirmation of President Bush's nomination of Janice R. Brown of California to be a judge for the U.S. Court of Appeals for the District of Columbia Circuit. On the California Supreme Court, she was a champion of private property rights. Confirmed 56-43: R 55-0; D 1-43; I 0-0. **LPPV POSITION: YES**

#2 - CONFIRM PRO-U.S. SOVEREIGNTY UNITED NATIONS REP — Senate Vote 142 - Bolton Nomination - Cloture
June 20, 2005 - Motion to invoke cloture (thus limiting debate) on President Bush's nomination of John R. Bolton of Maryland to be the permanent U.S. representative to the United Nations. Motion rejected 54-38: R 51-1; D 3-36; I 0-1. **LPPV POSITION: YES**

Note: Three-fifths of the total Senate (60) is required to invoke cloture. A "yea" was a vote in support of the president's position.

#3 - SHUT DOWN PUBLIC LANDS TO ENERGY EXPLORATION — Senate Vote 143 - HR 6: Energy Policy - Outer Continental Shelf Inventory
June 21, 2005 - Martinez, R-Fla., amendment no. 783 that would strike a section in the bill directing the Interior Department to make an assessment of oil and gas resources in the Outer Continental Shelf. Rejected 44-52: R 12-42; D 31-10; I 1-0. **LPPV POSITION: NO**

#4 - SHUT DOWN PUBLIC LANDS TO ALTERNATIVE ENERGY — Senate Vote 150 - HR 6: Energy Policy - Wind Power Projects
June 22, 2005 - Alexander, R-Tenn., amendment no. 961 that would bar subsidies for all wind power projects within 20 miles of highly scenic areas and federal land, including national parks, lakeshores and wildlife refuges. Environmental impact statements for all projects within 20 miles of such areas would be required and communities would be given six months notice before a project is permitted. Rejected 32-63: R 31-23; D 1-40; I 0-0. **LPPV POSITION: NO**

#5 - HAND OVER U.S. ECONOMIC POLICY TO THE U.N. — Senate Vote 151 - HR 6: Energy Policy - Climate Change

June 22, 2005 - Kerry, D-Mass., amendment no. 844 that would require the United States to negotiate global climate change issues within the requirements of, and abide by the decisions of, the United Nations Framework Convention of Climate Change. Rejected 46-49: R 7-47; D 39-2; I 0-0. **LPPV POSITION: NO**

#6 - OPEN UP PUBLIC LANDS TO ENERGY EXPLORATION — Senate Vote 364 - HR 2863: Fiscal 2006 Defense Appropriations - Cloture
December 21, 2005 - Motion to invoke cloture (thus limiting debate) on the conference report on the bill that would allow oil and gas leasing in the Arctic National Wildlife Refuge. Motion rejected 56-44: R 52-3; D 4-40; I 0-1. **LPPV POSITION: YES**

Note: Three-fifths of the total Senate (60) is required to invoke cloture. A "yea" was a vote in support of the president's position.

#7 - LIMIT LAND ACQUISITION SPENDING — Senate Vote 65 - S Con Res 83: Fiscal 2007 Budget Resolution - Discretionary Spending Point of Order
March 16, 2006 - Inhofe, R-Okl., amendment no. 3093 that would create a 67-vote point of order against any non-defense discretionary spending that would exceed the spending level of the previous fiscal year. Rejected 35-62: R 34-18; D 1-43 (ND 1-39, SD 0-4); I 0-1. **LPPV POSITION: YES**

#8 - REPEAL THE DEATH TAX — Senate Vote 164 - HR 8: Estate Tax Permanent Repeal - Cloture
June 08, 2006 - Motion to invoke cloture (thus limiting debate) on the motion to proceed to a bill that would permanently repeal the estate tax. Motion rejected 57-41: R 53-2; D 4-38 (ND 2-36, SD 2-2); I 0-1. **LPPV POSITION: YES**

Note: Three-fifths of the total Senate (60) is required to invoke cloture. A "yea" was a vote in support of the president's position.

#9 - DELAY WATER DEVELOPMENT PROJECTS — Senate Vote 208 - S 728: Water Resources Development Act Reauthorization - Independent Peer Review
July 19, 2006 - Feingold, D-Wis., amendment no. 4681 that would require an independent panel of experts to review certain studies for water resources projects costing more than \$40 million, causing unnecessary delays. Adopted 54-46: R 16-39; D 37-7 (ND 35-5, SD 2-2); I 1-0. **LPPV POSITION: NO**



US HOUSE VOTES

#1 - REPEAL THE DEATH TAX – House Vote

102 - HR 8: Estate Tax Permanent Repeal - Passage

April 13, 2005 - Passage of the bill that would make permanent the repeal of the estate tax contained in the 2001 tax cut law (PL 107-16) and which is set to expire after 2010.

Passed 272-162: R 230-1; D 42-160; I 0-1.

LPPV POSITION: YES

#2 - PROHIBIT FUNDING FOR CONDEMNATION OF PROPERTY – House Vote

350 - HR 3058: Fiscal 2006 Transportation-

Treasury-Housing Appropriations - Eminent Domain

June 30, 2005 - Garrett, R-N.J., amendment that would prohibit the use of funds in the bill to improve or construct infrastructure support on private property obtained through the power of eminent domain for private development.

Adopted 231-189: R 192-31; D 39-157; I 0-1.

#3 - DERAIL REFORM OF THE ENDANGERED SPECIES ACT – House Vote

505 - HR 3824: Endangered Species Act Overhaul - Substitute

September 29, 2005 - Miller, D-Calif., substitute amendment that would make insignificant changes to the Endangered Species Act, and only through 2010. This substitute was designed to derail Congressman Richard Pombo's excellent ESA reform bill (see vote #6).

Rejected 206-216: R 29-198; D 176-18; I 1-0.

#4 - ENDANGERED SPECIES ACT REFORM, INCLUDING COMPENSATION FOR PROPERTY OWNERS – House Vote 506 - HR

3824: Endangered Species Act Overhaul - Passage

September 29, 2005 - Passage of the bill that would overhaul and reauthorize the Endangered Species Act through 2010. It would replace the critical habitat

designation with expanded authority to develop recovery plans for species that take into account areas of "special value" in conserving an endangered or threatened species. The Interior Department would be required to reimburse landowners who are not allowed to develop their land because of protections for endangered species. It also would authorize grants for private landowners to protect endangered species.

Passed 229-193: R 193-34; D 36-158; I 0-1.

LPPV POSITION: YES

#5 - PRETENDING TO OVERTURN "KELO" EMINENT DOMAIN SUPREME COURT DECISION – House Vote 566 - HR 4128

November 03, 2005 - Turner, R-Ohio, amendment that would specify allegedly "harmful" uses of land. It would permit the use of eminent domain in such cases. This amendment was designed to undermine House-approved legislation to overturn the "Kelo" Supreme Court decision. It would have opened up a giant loophole for arrogant government agencies and corrupt officials to seize private property and hand it over to other private parties.

Rejected 56-357: R 28-192; D 28-164; I 0-1.

#6 - EXPEDITE SALVAGE LOGGING — House Vote 151 - HR 4200: Salvage Logging - Passage

May 17, 2006 - Passage of the bill that would expedite projects to rehabilitate federal land after catastrophic events, such as fires, floods, or other disasters. Timber harvesting would be allowed on damaged land when trees are dead, down, or broken after a disaster; there is a high probability that the trees will die within five years; or when trees have to be removed for public safety. The bill would permit the two agencies to assist state and local governments in restoring non-federal land after a disaster.

Passed 243-182: R 202-26; D 41-155 (ND 16-129, SD 25-26); I 0-1. **LPPV POSITION: YES**

Note: A "yea" was a vote in support of the president's position.

**#7 - OVER-REGULATE WETLANDS — House
Vote 169 - HR 5386: Fiscal 2007 Interior-
Environment Appropriations - Intrastate Bodies of
Water**

May 18, 2006 - Oberstar, D-Minn., amendment that would bar the use of funds in the bill to enforce current EPA policy that isolated, intrastate bodies of water are not necessarily subject to environmental regulations under the Clean Water Act.

Adopted 222-198: R 37-187; D 184-11 (ND 141-4, SD 43-7); I 1-0.

**#8 - ANWR OIL EXPLORATION — House Vote
209 - HR 5429: Arctic National Wildlife Refuge -
Passage**

May 25, 2006 - Passage of the bill that would authorize leases for oil and gas exploration, development, and production in the coastal plain of Alaska's Arctic National Wildlife Refuge (ANWR). It would allow the first lease sale of at least 200,000 acres to be held within 22 months of the bill's enactment. Lessees would be required to pay the federal government royalties of at least 12.5 percent of the product value removed or sold as determined by the agency. It would ban the exportation of oil pumped in ANWR and it would limit to 2,000 acres the area covered by wells, roads and other production infrastructure.

Passed 225-201: R 198-30; D 27-170 (ND 7-140, SD 20-30); I 0-1.

LPPV POSITION: YES

Note: A "yea" was a vote in support of the president's position.

**#9 - OFFSHORE OIL/GAS EXPLORATION—
House Vote 356 - HR 4761: Offshore Drilling -
Passage**

June 29, 2006 - Passage of the bill that would end a federal moratorium on most offshore exploration and development of oil and natural gas but give states more control over drilling along their coasts. The bill would require the Interior Department to offer leases for offshore oil and gas drilling for 75 percent of available offshore locations on the Outer Continental Shelf. Drilling would be banned out to 50 miles off the coasts. States could repeal the ban and pursue exploration closer to the coast or extend protection to 100 miles.
